BAND CLASS EXPECTATIONS

Appropriate listening when someone is talking

It is expected when a director or staff member is talking you address that person with your EYES and give them your full attention.

Inappropriate Talking

When a director or staff member is talking, you should **NOT** be talking. If another student talks to you at an inappropriate time, **DO NOT RESPOND**. They will get the message.

It is expected when you address adults that you refer to them as "Mr." or "Ms." and "Sir" or "Ma'am". This could be chaperones, staff members, bus drivers, teachers, administration, etc...

GENERAL PROCEDURES

EVENT	RESPONSE
Entering the classroom	Get instrument, go directly to your seat and warm up on your own
Beginning rehearsal	Director on podium/class is silent
Going to the restroom	Discreetly ask director for permission
Leaving the room	Sign out on the hall pass ledger
Entering the room	Sign in on the hall pass ledger

Returning to the ensemble	Discreetly take your seat
Asking a question	Raise your hand and wait to be acknowledged by director
Responding to a question	Raise your hand and wait to be acknowledged by director
Locker Use	Locker ALWAYS locked and neat, cases closed/latched
Instrument Maintenance	Before rehearsal start
Turning in money (CASH or MONEY ORDERS ONLY)	Place envelope with name/amount in black safe marked "Gary" in band office
Listening to announcements	Silence
Fire/weather/lock down drills	Report to designated areas quietly
Agenda for rehearsal	Posted at beginning - be prepared in place on time
Getting extra help	Ask director to schedule a date/time
Greeting someone	Say "Hello" or "Good Morning"
Practicing your instrument	Structured, DAILY, sessions of 20-30 minutes or more
Storing Music	Music remains in YOUR folder in the folder cabinet
Post rehearsal	Chairs and stands neat, floor clear

	Tone Quality (Performs with a full and resonant sound)
	- <u>ALL</u> flute players and <u>ALL</u> soloist are <u>required</u> to play with vibrato. Note Accuracy (Performs <u>ALL</u> notes as written)
	Rhythm Accuracy (Performs <u>ALL</u> rhythms as written)
	Performs with the correct musical style (Ex. March, Lyrical, Technical)
	Intonation (Performs <u>ALL</u> notes in-tune)
	Articulations (Performs <u>ALL</u> articulation markings correctly: slur, tie, tenuto, staccato, marcato, accent, etc.,)
··	Phrasing(Performs music with shape, staggers breath, plays through barline)
 	Playing Position (Performs with appropriate posture: back straight and off of chair)
	Blend (Performs with personal tone integrated within your section)
	Balance (Perform with volume relative to your instrument's role in the music and use percentages such as 50%, 35%, 15% to balance cadence chords)
	Tempo (Performs with an awareness of pulse, subdivision, and music symbols ritardando, accelerando etc.)
	Dynamics (Performs volume symbols in music: fff,ff,f,mf,mp p,pp,ppp, crescendo Decrescendo, Diminuendo, etc.)
	Conductor (Performs music and follow cues from the Director)

	hic (Ex. Come to class with instrument, music, and actively listens)
Practice	(Consistently practices and strives to become a better musician)
Listen to	professional recordings of musicians and performance pieces
Maintain	a 90 or higher grade average in band class
Attend A	LL after school rehearsals and the LGPE performance
